COURSE REGISTRATION:

All course requests must be entered into Unified Classroom. The Course Registration Portal will be open from **Pass. 1 - Pass. 9.** Please enter your course requests during this time; we start to make choices about course offerings based on your preliminary requests.

SENIOR OPTION 8:

Students who have earned 20 credits through the end of 5 semesters (all credits possible as of the end of first semester, 2023-2024) and have parent approval will be allowed to sign up for a senior option (late arrival, early dismissal, work experience, internship, community service, college course) during their individual planning session.

3EMINAR 8:

Students are not able to register for seminars in the computer. If a student is interested in pursuing a seminar, the conversation must begin with the teacher in the content area of the seminar. A written proposal is completed and must be approved by the principal before registration for the seminar can occur. If you have any questions, please address them with your counselor during your registration appointment.

ALTERNATIVE COURSES

When entering your course requests in Unified Classroom, you will be asked to select three alternative courses to be used in the case of scheduling conflicts, overenrolled or cancelled classes. Be sure to select these alternatives carefully, as they will be put into your schedule as needed and will fall under the same Add/Drop process as any other course.


When making your requests, keep in mind:







TOLLAND HIGH SCHOOL REQUEST for SENIOR OPTION 2024-2025

Dear Parent/Quardian,

Your sonification has expressed an interest in enrolling in a Senior Option for the 2024-2025 school year. The types of Senior Option programs are explained on the back of this form.

To request a senior option juniors must have earned 20 credits by the end of the first semester of junior year. To participate in senior option, seniors must have earned 24 credits to participate in semester 1 and earned 27 credits to participate in semester 2.

Students must provide their own transportation and must not be on school grounds during the time of their senior option. Students interested in any of the Senior Option programs make their own amangements (i.e. set up the internship, register for a college course, etc.). Students and their families are responsible for any costs incurred if enrolling in a college course.

If you approve of your student taking a Senior Option next year, please sign below, and have your student return the form to his/her school counselor. Once received, students participating in internship, community service, a college course or work experience will be given a more detailed form to complete and return prior to the beginning of next school year.

Requesting senior option does not automatically ensure that the student will receive it. The scheduling of senior option does not take precedent over the scheduling of any classes. Please contact your student's school counselor with any questions.

TOLLAND HIGH 8CHOOL SENIOR OFFICIAL INFORMATION SHEET

2024-2025

For the 2004-2005 school year, the Senior Options program will consist of: Interestip, Community Service, College Course, Work Experience, Late Arrival and Early Dismissal. These options will be considered in lieu of a regularly scheduled fourth block class or first block class or first block class in the case of Late Arrival.

CREDIT OPTION 8:

INTERNSHIP

Internation will provide interested students with the opportunity to explore an area related to their career interests. Students selecting this option must:

Have a mentor at the organization/school/business at which they will be interning. Interns at district achools must also secure permission from the building principal.

Submit a written proposal outlining the goals for their experience and the hours they will be interning (students must actively participate at least 5 hours per week at their site).

Attend scheduled meetings with the Senior Options Coordinator and complete required logs or other assignments (mentor rubrics, etc.).

One-half (5) credit will be granted upon successful completion of an internship. Grading will be on a Para-Fail basis. Students who do not complete their internship successfully will receive an 'F', which will be noted on their transcript, and will not be eligible for any other senior option. Additional paperwork as required prior to the start of the seminator.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The community service option allows students to volunteer their time in service to others. Students enrolled in this option will be expected to coordinate their service with a local institution (hospital, numing bornic, soup labelen, Human Services, etc.), and follow the same guidelines and procedures as outlined in the Internship option. One-half (.5) credit will be gented for a successful community service option. This option also includes completing at least 5 hours of service per visits. Additional paperwork or required prior to the start of the services.

COLLEGE COURSE

Students electing this option enroll in a college course at a degree-granting institution. Students must submit proof of registration to their counsator before being enrolled in this option. Students will be awarded, 5 HTS credit for a college course only after an official teasoning from the institution is received in the Counseling Office. Students will not be required to attend regularly scheduled meetings with the Senior Options Coordinator. Students and their tension are responsible for any tution, fees and/or books and materials required, and must provide their own transportation. Students must also courses that begin no earlier than 1:00 p.m. Additional paperwork is nequired prior to the start of the vernedate.

NON-CREDIT OPTION 8:

WORK EXPERIENCE

This senior option will allow students who have part-time employment to develop the necessary skills to be successful in the <u>web-skies</u>. Employment does not need to be related to a feature career <u>returned-lag</u> must be for a minimum of 5 hours per week. Additional page-work is required prior to the start of the semester. NO CREDIT will be awarded for this option. This option is only offered during Block 4.

LATE ARRIVAL

This senior option allows for a serior to not take a Block 1 class. Students must arrive by the beginning of Block 2 regardless of what time Block 2 begins. Students are not to be in the building or on school property during the Block 1 time without prior approval.

EARLY DISMISSAL

This senior option is only offered during Block 4. Students must leave by the beginning of Block 4, regardless of what time Block 4 begins. They are not to remain in the building or on school property without prior approval.

**Students who participate in these non-credit options will only be taking three credit earning courses. Student-athletes must be aware that failure of any of these three courses will result in athletic ineligibility. **



UCONN ECE COURSES

Students selecting UCONN ECE courses in Biology may choose to take the course for either one or two semesters. You are not required to take both semesters. There is a fee associated with taking the UCONN ECE classes.

For students who are not interested in earning UCONN credit, but who want the challenge of these courses, you may select to take the course at the Honors level. There are no fees associated with Honors level courses. (No H level offered for Biology)

Remember that after the last day of school for <u>this</u> school year, you may <u>NOT CHANGE</u> your course requests, unless you meet one of the criteria noted in the Add/Drop Process.

The Add/Drop Process is detailed on our webpage and on the handout given to you today.

Alternatives

This year, alternatives will automatically be entered into your schedule by PowerSchool if there is a conflict. Choose carefully!

2 alternatives are required, 3 are requested.

Your Registration Appointment

- Review of graduation requirements, credit standing and service hours. (*grad requirement vs resume/NHS/ scholarship purposes*)
- Review of recommendations, course requests and alternatives.
- Review of goals, resume and NEST.
- Post High School Planning
