- \* Select activities through school clubs
- \* Volunteer work through a faith community

Students are responsible for submitting the verification form on the reverse side of this document to school counselors to earn credit for their service.





During the 2023-2024 school year, all sophomores will continue to use Naviance Student. The tools in Naviance Student will help you as you begin to think about life after high school.


This year we will encourage you to do some self exploration using some of the self discovery tools/assessments.


### Tasks from My School
